We will be learning about place value, including numbers up to one thousand as well as rounding and comparing numbers. We will also learn about Roman Numerals. We will be continuing to learn our times tables so please do keep this up at home! Keep your eyes peeled for our weekly homework which also has some maths questions to keep our brains ticking over.

English

We will be using the text 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl to practise our reading and discuss elements of the text. In our writing we will be focusing on sentence structure and punctuation before delving into our first unit of creative writing.



Religion and World Views (RWV)

In RWV, we will be exploring the big question: Why do we celebrate? As part of this interesting study, we will explore different reasons people celebrate and how we may celebrate both good things and difficult things.



Science: Food and the Digestive System

This project teaches children about the human digestive system. They explore the main parts, starting with the mouth and teeth, identifying teeth types and their functions. They link this learning to animals' diets and construct food chains to show the flow of energy.

History: Invasion

This project teaches children about life in Britain after the Roman withdrawal. Children will learn about Anglo-Saxon and Viking invasions up to the Norman Conquest.



PSHE: Me and My Relationships

Children will enjoy exploring families and friendships and what they should accept and expect in these relationships. They will explore what makes a safe relationship and how relationships can make us feel different emotions.

PE: Hockey and Netball

We will be learning Hockey and netball in our PE sessions. We will focus on learning to collaborate with others in team games as well as passing, dribbling, shooting and invasion tactics.



Art: Warm and Cool Colours

This essential skills and knowledge project teaches children about colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of warm and cool colours, Aboriginal art and how artists use colour in their artwork.

Music: Combining Elements

Children will learn how music relates to history, stories, our past (and our future!); this theme is relevant to learning topics such as cultural identity, changing ideas and inventions over time, creativity, film, TV and communication.



Geography: Interconnected World

This essential skills and knowledge project teaches children about compass points and four and six-figure grid references. They learn about the tropics and the countries, climates and culture of North and South America. Children identify physical features in the United Kingdom and learn about the National Rail and canal networks.
