



# EYFS Curriculum Map - Autumn Term 1 2025 - Oak Class

## Welcome

Welcome to Little Gonerby Church of England Primary Academy. We are thrilled to have you as part of our school family!

### Communication and Language (CL)

This term focuses on speaking and listening skills through activities like self-introductions, sharing personal interests, and story discussions. Carpet time encourages turn-taking and active listening, while observing and talking about environmental changes fosters curiosity and expressive language.



### Personal, Social and Emotional (PSED)

This term we focus on developing self-awareness, independence, and social skills. Activities include recognising and naming emotions using tools like The Colour Monster, exploring diversity and difference, and learning to share. Children also build independence through practical tasks such as using the toilet, washing hands, and putting on their coat.

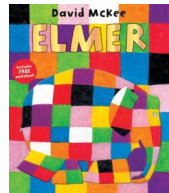


### Physical Development (PD)

We are focusing on building fine and gross motor skills alongside key school readiness routines. Children practise school skills like lining up and managing dinner time, explore movement with playground equipment, and develop fine motor control through activities such as threading and printing in playdough.

### Literacy

The children will be learning nursery rhymes and singing them together with their new friends. The children will be introduced to traditional stories and begin to understand that order in stories is important.



### Maths

This term we focus on sorting, matching and comparing. The children will play games where they need to identify objects and use key phrases such as 'same' and 'different' and explain why. They will also be exploring patterns and creating their own **simple** repeating pattern.

### RWV

We focus on exploring personal identity, feelings, and values. Through stories, discussions, and reflection, children learn about themselves and others, developing respect, empathy, and understanding. The values of the term are embedded throughout, supporting children's social and emotional growth.

### Understanding of the World

In our topic of 'All about me' we help children explore themselves and their surroundings. Activities include becoming familiar with their new environment, identifying body parts by drawing and labelling a friend, and talking about familiar people. Children learn about celebrations, appreciate differences in others, and observe seasonal changes in autumn, encouraging curiosity and respect for the world around them.



### Expressive Arts and Design

We encourage creativity and self-expression through music, art, and imaginative play. Children explore body movement with songs like 'Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes', name colours, and create self-portraits focusing on facial features. They use various printing techniques such as handprints, finger printing, and object printing, to express themselves, and represent their families using small parts, fostering fine motor skills and imaginative thinking.
